STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend sections 36, 37 and 40 of chapter 29 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors, and particularly the manufacture and sale of cider.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty-six of chapter twenty-nine of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words 3 "except cider" in the third line, so that said section as 4 amended shall read as follows:

'Section 36. Whoever manufactures for sale any intoxicat- 6 ing liquor, except cider, and whoever sells any intoxicating 7 liquor manufactured by him in this State, shall be imprisoned 8 two months and fined one thousand dollars.'

Sect. 2. Section thirty-seven of chapter twenty-nine of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of
3 said section after the word "cider" in the first line, and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the words 'containing at the time of such
5 sale not more than three per cent of alcohol,' so that said
6 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 37. This chapter does not apply to the sale of
8 unadulterated cider, containing at the time of such sale not
9 more than three per cent of alcohol.'

Sect. 3. Section forty of chapter twenty-nine of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
3 "kept or deposited with intent to sell the same for tipping
4 purposes or as a beverage" in the fourth and fifth lines of
5 said section, and inserting in place thereof the words 'con-
6 taining more than three per cent of alcohol' so that said sec-
7 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 40. No person shall at any time, by himself, his
9 clerk, servant or agent, directly or indirectly, sell any intoxi-
10 cating liquors, of whatever origin, except as hereinbefore
11 provided; wine, ale, porter, strong beer, lager beer and all
12 other malt liquors, and cider when containing more than
13 three per cent of alcohol, as well as all distilled spirits, are
14 declared intoxicating within the meaning of this chapter; but
15 this enumeration shall not prevent any other pure or mixed
16 liquors from being considered intoxicating.'
