## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

---

AN ACT to prevent throwing refuse and garbage into the  
Aroostook River within the limits of Fort Fairfield Village  
Corporation.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. No person or persons shall deposit in the waters,  
2 or upon the banks of the Aroostook river, within the limits  
3 of Fort Fairfield Village Corporation as now defined by law,  
4 any garbage or refuse or waste matter arising or produced  
5 from the cleaning up of yards, streets, grounds, stores,  
6 stables, or other buildings; nor shall any person or persons  
7 deposits in the waters or upon the banks of the Aroostook

8 river within the limits of Fort Fairfield Village Corporation  
9 as now defined by law any dead animal of any kind. This  
10 act shall not apply to sewage nor to pumice from starch  
11 factories.

Sect. 2. Any person who violates the provisions of section  
2 one shall be punished for the first offense by a fine of not  
3 less than five dollars and not more than ten dollars, and upon  
4 any subsequent conviction by a fine of not less than ten dol-  
5 lars, or by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days, and in  
6 all prosecutions under this chapter trial justices shall have  
7 jurisdiction by complaint made and signed by any constable  
8 or police officer within said village corporation, or by any  
9 taxpayer resident therein.
