STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section forty-four of chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to close time for smelts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section forty-four of chapter forty-one of the
- 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word
- 3 "Taunton" in the twenty-fourth line and inserting in its place
- 4 the word 'Franklin' and by adding thereto the following
- 5 words 'nor to smelts taken in West bay and West Bay stream,
- 6 so called, in the town of Gouldsboro, Hancock county,
- 7 between the first and the fifteenth days of April,' so that said
- 8 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 44. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in tidal 10 waters, except by hook and line, between the first days of 11 April and October, under a penalty of not less than ten, nor 12 more than thirty dollars for each offence, and a further

13 penalty of twenty cents for each smelt so taken; and all weirs 14 for the capture of smelts shall be open and so remain, and all 15 nets used in the smelt and tom cod fishery, shall be taken 16 from the water on or before said first day of April, under a 17 penalty of not less than twenty, nor more than fifty dollars, 18 and a further fine of five dollars for each day that any such 19 weir or net remains in violation of law. But weirs with 20 catch pounds covered with nets, the meshes of which are one 21 inch square in the clear, or greater, are not subject to this 22 section. But no smelts caught in such weirs after the first 23 day of April, shall be sold or offered for sale in this State, 24 nor shall smelts caught in any manner between the first day 25 of April and the first day of October following be offered 26 for sale, sold or shipped from the State under a penalty of 27 twenty-five dollars for each offence; provided, however, that 28 dip nets may be used between the first day of April and the 29 first day of May, and all smelts caught by dip nets between 30 said days may be lawfully offered for sale and sold in this 31 State; provided, further, that this section does not apply to 32 smelts taken in the Androscoggin river above the Merry-33 meeting bay bridge, between the first days of October and 34 November, nor to smelts taken in the Penobscot river and its 35 tributaries between the first and thirtieth days of April, nor 36 to smelts taken in Casco bay between the fifteenth day of 37 September and the first day of October, nor to smelts taken 38 in Franklin bay between the first day of April and the first 39 day of May, nor to smelts taken in Little Kennebec bay, so 40 called, in the county of Washington between the first day of 41 April and the first day of May, nor to smelts taken in West 42 bay and West Bay stream, so called, in the town of Goulds-43 boro, Hancock county, between the first and the fifteenth 44 days of April.'
