STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter eighty-six of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three, entitled "An Act to authorize the Orono Pulp and Paper Company to generate, use and sell electricity."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section one of chapter eighty-six of the Private
- 2 and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three is hereby
- 3 amended by striking out the words "the cities of Old Town,
- 4 Bangor, Brewer, and the towns of Orono and Veazie" in the
- 5 fifth and sixth lines, and inserting in the place thereof the
- 6 words, 'any part of Penobscot county.' Also in the same
- 7 section by striking out all the words after the word "pur-

8 poses" in the tenth line, and inserting in the place thereof the 9 words, 'other than to the Public Works Company or its suc10 cessors, and also to any railroad company which is operated
11 by steam, or its successors, to be used in moving trains or
12 cars,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The Orono Pulp and Paper Company is hereby 14 specially authorized and empowered to make and generate 15 electricity upon its property situated upon the Stillwater 16 branch of the Penobscot river in Old Town in Penobscot 17 county, and to transmit and conduct such electricity to and 18 into any part of Penobscot county and to use the same in all 19 ways for its own purposes, and to sell the same for power and 20 manufacturing purposes in units of not less than twenty-five 21 horse power, and also for heating purposes, but not for electric lighting or street railway purposes other than to the 23 Public Works Company, or its successors, and also to sell the 24 same to any railroad company which is operated by steam, 25 or its successors, to be used in moving trains or cars.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
