STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT relating to the Pine Grove Cemetery of Falmouth,

Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The Pine Grove Cemetery, a corporation organ-

- 2 ized under the laws of this State, and located at Falmouth,
- 3 in the county of Cumberland, (which organization is hereby
- 4 ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid), is
- 5 authorized and empowered for the purposes of its organiza-
- 6 tion, to receive, take and hold, by deed, devise, bequest, or
- 7 otherwise, whether heretofore or hereafter made, property,
- 8 personal or real, to the amount of fifty thousand dollars.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is authorized and empowered to 2 erect and maintain a receiving tomb, purchase and maintain

- 3 a hearse, and do any similar act that may from time to time4 be determined upon by vote of the corporation.
- Sect. 3. Said corporation is authorized and empowered to 2 enter into contracts with the owners of lots, and other per-3 sons, to receive moneys for the purpose of providing for the 4 grading and perpetual care of lots in said cemetery, or those 5 subsequently purchased; also to provide for the perpetual 6 care of the monuments and stones upon such lots, or those 7 hereafter erected. The funds received for such purposes 8 shall be deposited in banking or trust companies in the name 9 of the corporation, and such deposits shall be so arranged as 10 to identify the person from whom such fund is received, and 11 such moneys shall be expended strictly in accordance with 12 the agreement under which the same are received and held.
 - Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
