STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE for an amendment to the Constitution by abrogating and annulling amendment five adopted on the 8th day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, relating to the sale and manufacture of intoxicating liquors.

Resolved, Two-thirds of both houses of the legislature con-2 curring, that the following amendment to the Constitution 3 of the State be proposed, viz.: Amendment five of the Con-4 stitution adopted on the eighth day of September, in the year 5 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, 6 relating to the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors 7 is hereby abrogated and annulled.

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, selectmen of towns 9 and assessors of plantations, in this State, are hereby empow-10 ered and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respective 11 cities, towns and plantations, in the manner prescribed by
12 law, at the September election next ensuing after the pas13 sage and approval of these resolves, to give in their votes on
14 the question whether the amendment to the Constitution
15 proposed to the foregoing resolve shall be made; and the
16 question proposed in the resolve shall be: Shall the Consti17 tution be amended so as to abrogate and annul amendment
18 five of the Constitution, adopted on the eighth day of Sep19 tember in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
20 and eighty-four, relating to the manufacture and sale of
21 intoxicating liquors?

And the inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations 23 shall vote by ballot on said question, those in favor of said 24 amendment expressing it by the word "yes" upon their bal-25 lots, and those opposed to said amendment expressing it by 26 the word "no" upon their ballots, and the ballots shall be 27 received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town 28 and plantation meeting, and lists of the votes so received 29 shall be made and returned to the secretary of State in the 30 same manner as votes for governor, and the governor and 31 council shall count the same and make return to the legislature and if a majority of the votes are in favor of said 33 amendment, the Constitution shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved, That the secretary of State shall prepare and 35 furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations ballots 36 and blank returns in conformity to the foregoing resolves, 37 accompanied with a copy thereof.
