# STATE OF MAINE.

To the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Agreeable to an order passed by your honorable bodies, I hereby present a detailed statement of all salaries paid at the University of Maine, together with the number of students from each state up to January 4, 1905.

#### SALARIES.

Below is a list of persons under pay in the University of Maine, January 4, 1905, with their duties and salaries.

The scale of salaries is as follows: Professor, \$1,500 to \$1,800; assistant professor, \$1,200; instructor, \$600 to \$1,000; tutor, \$500; assistant, \$250.

Some of the employees in the list are also employees of the Experiment Station, and receive only a part of their pay from the college treasury. The combined salaries are at the rates given above. Sundry students are employed at fifteen cents per hour for various kinds of labor. The president has the use of an unfurnished house with heat and light, and pays, personally, certain commencement and other college entertainment expenses. The head janitor has the use of an unfurnished house.
