STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT granting Belonie Hebert and Sons the right to erect and maintain piers and booms on the Saint John river in the town of Madawaska.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Belonie Hebert, Thomas Hebert, Denis Hebert 2 and F. W. Pelletier, under the firm of Belonie Hebert, F. 3 W. Pelletier and Sons, of Madawaska, county of Aroos-4 took, in the State of Maine, their associates and assigns, are 5 hereby authorized and empowered to erect and maintain 6 piers and booms on the Saint John river at a point known 7 as Martin island (and formerly called Indian island), begin-8 ning at said Belonie Hebert's eastern or lower line of his 9 homestead farm which comprises a part of lot numbered one

10 hundred thirty-seven (137) and extending along lots num11 bers one hundred thirty-six (136), one hundred thirty-five
12 (135) and one hundred thirty-four (134), in said town of
13 Madawaska, for the purpose of sorting and holding all logs
14 and lumber intended for use in the manufacture of lumber at
15 said Belonie Hebert and Sons' mill; but in no way shall they
16 be constructed so as to impede navigation or to unreasonably
17 obstruct the common use of said river.

Sect. 2. Said Belonie Hebert and Sons, their associates and 2 assigns, with their agents, servants and teams, may pass and 3 repass over the shore along which their piers and booms shall 4 be situated and to and from the shores for the purpose of 5 erecting and maintaining said piers and booms and to connect 6 the same with the shore, but not otherwise.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
