IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the president and trustees of the Farmington Home for Aged People.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Julia W. Butler, Lydia P. Holley, Anna B.

- 10 incorporated by the name of the president and trustees of the

11 Farmington Home for Aged People, for the purpose of pro-12 viding a suitable home for aged persons who may be in need 13 of such home.

Sect. 2. Under the above name, said corporation may sue 2 and be sued, take by purchase, gift, devise, bequest or other-3 wise, real and personal property, and hold the same for the 4 purpose expressed in section one, to an amount not exceeding 5 one hundred thousand dollars; and may control, manage, sell 6 and dispose of the same for the purpose aforesaid; and shall 7 possess all the rights, privileges and immunities and be sub-8 ject to all the duties and liabilities that pertain and belong to 9 corporations created for charitable purposes under the laws 10 of this State.

Sect. 3. Said corporation shall elect a president and trus2 tees, not less than five in number, and may elect such other
3 officers as they may deem proper; may appoint a board of
4 management, or such officer or officers as they may deem
5 proper, for the control and conduct of any home established
6 under this act; prescribe rules and regulations for the admis7 sion and discharge of persons, as inmates of said home; adopt
8 all necessary rules and by-laws, and do all other acts neces9 sary or expedient for the establishment and management of
10 said home, not inconsistent with the laws of this State or of
11 the United States of America.

Sect. 4. The first meeting of the corporation for the pur-2 pose of organization, may be called by any one of the above 3 named corporators by publication of a notice of the time and 4 place of such meeting, signed by such corporator, in any 5 newspaper printed and published in Farmington. Such

- 6 notice must be published at least fourteen days prior to such 7 meeting, and all subsequent meetings of said corporation, 8 must be held within the limits of Farmington Village Corgo poration.
 - Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
