STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT relating to the compensation of the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The governor with the advice and consent of

- 2 the council shall appoint one of the commissioners of inland
- 3 fisheries and game to be the chairman thereof, and he shall
- 4 be designated and commissioned as such for the term of two
- 5 years. After the expiration of the first term a chairman
- 6 shall be appointed in the manner and for the term now pre-
- 7 scribed by law for the appointment of any one of said com-
- 8 missioners; but the land agent shall not be eligible to the
- 9 office of chairman.

- Sect. 2. The chairman of the commissioners of inland 2 fisheries and game shall receive an annual salary of two thou3 sand dollars; the land agent, forest commissioner and mem4 ber of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, com5 bining the three offices in one appointee, two thousand 6 dollars; the other member of the commissioners of inland 7 fisheries and game, one thousand dollars, and in addition to 8 their salaries, actual traveling expenses to be audited by the 9 governor and council. The salary of the clerk of the com10 missioners of inland fisheries and game shall be seven hun11 dred and fifty dollars, and the salary of the clerk to the land 12 agent and forest commissioner shall be one thousand dollars.
- Sect. 3. Said salaries are payable quarterly, on the first 2 days of January, April, July and October of each year, from 3 the State treasury, and are in full for all services performed 4 by them in their official capacities.
- Sect. 4. So much of section twenty-two of chapter thirty2 two of the Revised Statutes, as provides "that the governor
 3 and council may allow the commissioners of inland fisheries
 4 and game, from the funds received from licenses and fines,
 5 such compensation as they may deem just and fair for the
 6 additional work required of them in carrying out the provi7 sions of this section and the two following sections" is hereby
 8 repealed.
- Sect. 5. This act shall take effect on the first day of July 2 one thousand nine hundred and five.
