AN ACT to amend and extend the charter of Sanford Trust
Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

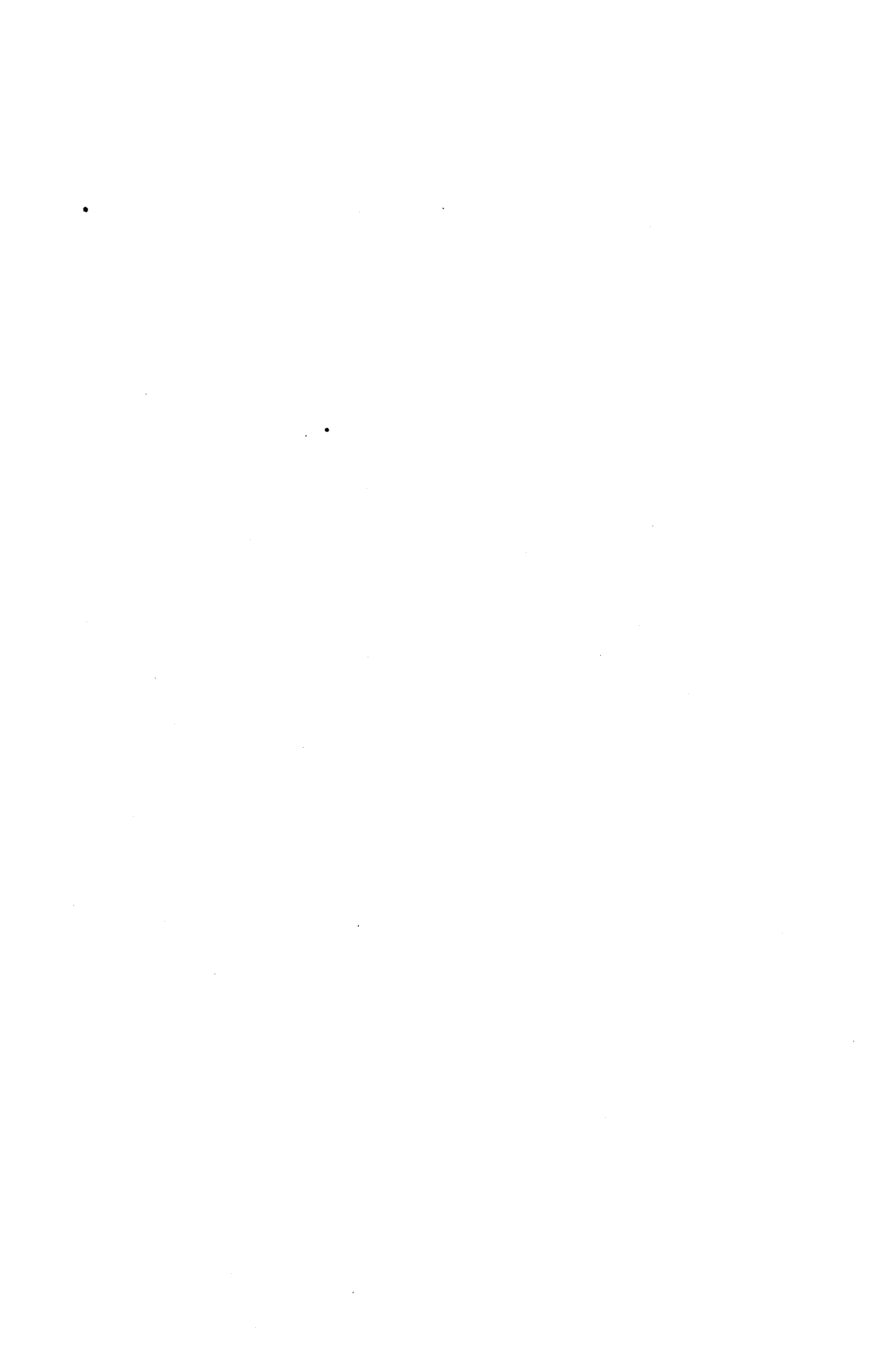
Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 469 of the Private and
2 Special Laws of 1901 are hereby amended by striking out
3 the whole of said section and inserting the following, so that
4 said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. Ernest M. Goodall, George B. Goodall, Louis
6 B. Goodall, M. A. Hewett, George H. Nowell, Fred J. Allen,
7 Harmon G. Allen, Natt T. Abbott, George A. Goodwin,
8 Newell T. Fogg, Hiram B. Rowe of Sanford, Justin M.
9 Leavitt of Kennebunkport, Lendall W. Nash of Kennebunk,
10 Samuel M. Came of Alfred, A. H. Bickmore of New York

11 City, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made
12 a body corporate and politic to be known as the Sanford
13 Trust Company, and as such shall be possessed of all the
14 powers, privileges and immunities and subject to all the
15 duties and obligations conferred on corporations by law.'

Sect. 2. The rights, powers and privileges of the Sanford
2 Trust Company which were granted by chapter four hundred
3 and sixty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of one thou-
4 sand nine hundred and one, as amended by section one of this
5 act, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of
6 this act, and the persons named in said act, their associates
7 and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges
8 that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the
9 same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said
10 act.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
