IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT for the protection of gray squirrels upon a certain
territory in Fryeburg, Oxford county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to hunt or kill at any time,
2 gray squirrels upon the following described land or territory,
3 under a penalty of ten dollars for each offense:

On any lands lying east, north or northeast of the Saco or
5 Lower Kezar rivers, and one hundred rods distant therefrom,
6 from the gulf, so called, near Toll Bridge, so called, to the
7 outlet of Lower Kezar pond, in Oxford county.
