STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Marble brook, Marble pond, Chase brook, or Blackstone brook, in Piscataquis county, and Bolt brook, in Somerset county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or 2 kill in any way any kind of fish at any time in Marble brook 3 and Marble pond, so called, tributary waters to the Piscata-4 quis river, situated partly in the town of Blanchard, county 5 of Piscataquis, or in Chase brook, sometimes called Black-6 stone brook, also situated partly in said Blanchard, or in 7 Bolt brook, in Bald Mountain township, in Somerset county.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act 2 shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the gen-3 eral law for illegal fishing.
