STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Lake Webb, Franklin county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The close time for fishing, in which it shall be
2 unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any fish in Lake Webb,
3 so called, in the town of Weld, Franklin county, shall be from
4 October first of each year until the ice is entirely out of said
5 lake the following spring.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish at any time for any
2 kind of fish in this lake within one hundred and fifty feet of
3 the mouth of each and every tributary to said lake, from the
4 time the ice goes out in the spring until June first following,
5 and the commissioners of inland fisheries and game shall, by

6 suitable monuments, indicate the area in which it shall be
7 unlawful to fish as above specified in this section.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the State for illegal fishing.
