STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of repairing the bridge across the St. Croix
river near Squirrel Point in Baileyville.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and
2 hereby is appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and
3 five, in aid of repairing the bridge across the St. Croix river
4 at or near Squirrel Point in Baileyville and known as the
5 Squirrel Point bridge, the same to be expended by an agent
6 to be appointed by the governor and council, said amount not
7 to exceed one-half the amount actually expended in the
8 repair of said bridge to be paid upon the certificate of said
9 agent, that said bridge has been thoroughly repaired.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge connects the town of Baileyville with Indian township and is almost impassable owing to the town not being able to keep the same in repair.

Baileyville is a poor town with a population of 215, census 1900, and has thirty miles of road to keep up, which is all that they are able to do. One-half of this bridge lands on Indian township and is owned by the State and belongs to the State to keep in repair.
