STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit scallop fishing in Bluehill bay from the first day of April to the first day of November in each year.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy any scallop or scallops in Bluehill bay and the waters adjacent as far east as a line drawn from Bass Harbor Light southerly to Placentia Island, between the first day of April and the first day of November in each and every year.

Sect. 2. Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing section, shall be punished by a fine of one dollar for each and every scallop taken, caught, killed or destroyed contrary to the provisions of the foregoing section. Trial justices and judges of police and municipal courts shall have jurisdiction of all offences under this act.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and five.
