STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to extend the powers granted the St. John Lumber Company by chapter two hundred and one of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The St. John Lumber Company, a corporation 2 organized under the laws of the State of Maine, its succes-3 sors and assigns, is hereby authorized to maintain all of the 4 piers heretofore built by it in the St. John river in the town 5 of Van Buren, and all booms connected, or which may here-6 after be attached to or connected therewith, and to build and 7 maintain all other piers and booms in said river, which it may

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8 deem necessary for the better or more convenient carrying 9 on of its business, and of sorting and holding logs and lum-10 ber to be manufactured at its mills in the town of Van Buren, 11 from a point at or near its mills as at present located at or 12 near the foot of island numbered three in said river and 13 thence up along said river to a point opposite the upper line 14 of lot numbered two hundred forty in the town of Van 15 Buren.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
