## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section ninety-three of chapter four of the Revised Statutes relating to town and city by-laws and ordinances.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The paragraph numbered twelve of section ninety-three of 2 chapter four of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by 3 inserting after the word "cities" in the first line thereof the 4 words 'and all towns of more than five thousand inhabitants' 5 and also by inserting after the word "establish" in the same 6 line the words 'and adopt by-laws and' and also by inserting 7 after the word "such" in the last line of said section the 8 words 'by-laws and' so that said section as amended shall 9 read as follows:

'Cities and all towns of more than five thousand inhabitants II may establish and adopt by-laws and ordinances regulating 12 the purchase and sale of articles usually bought of old junk 13 dealers and dealers in second-hand articles, and the pawning 14 of articles with pawnbrokers, and may therein prescribe con- 15 ditions to be observed by buyers and sellers, pawners and 16 pawnbrokers, to prevent or detect the sale or purchase of 17 stolen goods; and suitable penalties may be prescribed in 18 such by-laws and ordinances.'
