IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to further regulate the analysis of food and agricultural seeds.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The director of the Maine Agricultural Experiment Station shall analyze, or cause to be analyzed, samples of agricultural seeds sold or offered for sale under the provisions of chapter 39 of the Revised Statutes. He shall take in person or by deputy, a sample, not exceeding four ounces in weight, for said analysis, from any lot or package of agricultural seeds which may be in the possession of any grower, importer, agent or dealer in the State.

Sect. 2. There shall be appropriated annually from the State treasury the sum of one thousand dollars in favor of

3 the treasurer of the Maine Agricultural Experiment Station,  
4 and the same may be expended in the analysis of food and  
5 agricultural seeds. So much of said appropriation shall be  
6 paid by the treasurer of State to the treasurer of said experi-  
7 ment station as the director of said station may show by his  
8 bills has been expended in performing the duties required  
9 by the acts regulating the sale and analysis of food and the  
10 sale of agricultural seeds. Such payment shall be made  
11 quarterly upon the order of the governor and council, who  
12 shall draw a warrant for that purpose.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
