STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and nineteen of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-one, as amended by chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine relating to the taking of spawn herring in Narraguagus bay.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred and nineteen of the Pri-

- 2 vate and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-one,
- 3 as amended by chapter one hundred and twenty-two of the
- 4 Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-
- 5 nine, is hereby amended by adding after the word "from" in
- 6 the fifth line of said section the words 'the southern extrem-

7 ity of Petit Manan point to; and adding after the word 8 "house" in the sixth line of said section the word 'thence, 9 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section I. The taking of herring or fishing therefor by
II the use of purse and drag seines or nets from the first day
I2 of July to the first day of November, is hereby prohibited in
I3 the waters lying within the jurisdiction of the State in MilI4 bridge or Narraguagus bay and other waters above a line
I5 drawn from the southern extremity of Petit Manan point to
I6 Petit Manan lighthouse, thence to Cape Split in the town of
I7 Addison, under a penalty upon the master or person in charge
I8 of said seines or nets, or upon the owner or owners of the
I9 vessels, steamers or boats engaged in taking said herring, of
20 not less than one hundred dollars, and no more than three
I2 hundred dollars, and there shall be a lien upon said vessels,
I2 steamers, boats and apparatus used in such unlawful pursuit
I3 until said penalty, with costs of prosecution is paid.'
