STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of navigation on Lewey, Long and Big lakes.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars
2 is hereby appropriated to complete placing and maintaining
3 buoys in Lewey lake, Long lake and Big lake in Washington
4 county. Said buoys shall be placed at such points on said
5 waters as will best serve the needs of navigation thereof. All
6 said money to be expended under the direction of the State
7 steamboat inspectors.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The waters in question are largely navigable and the tourist travel has increased so much that the safety of the public requires buoys defining the narrow and crooked channel in certain parts of the lakes mentioned. This appropriation is to complete buoying the lakes in question.
