STATEMENT OF FACTS TO ACCOMPANY HOUSE RESOLVE NO. 267.

This money is to be expended on a road leading from Fort Kent to a settlement of about seventy-five people having no roads at all. Their only way to get to civilization is to cross Eagle lake, which is sixteen miles long and from two to three miles wide, by boat when the wind does not blow too hard, or on the ice when it is strong enough to carry them.
