STATEMENT OF FACTS TO ACCOMPANY SENATE DOCUMENT No. 112.

Waldo County General Hospital is situated at Belfast, Maine, and is incorporated under the laws of this State. This institution was opened about the middle of November, 1904. All who are not able to pay, if deserving, are treated and cared for free.

The hospital is thoroughly equipped with the most modern appliances, furnished by the New York Hospital Supply Company, and is provided with a care-taker, matron and nurse of seven years' experience. A staff of local physicians is in attendance who give their services free.

The management of the hospital is in the care of an association formed of a number of the leading citizens of Belfast.

It is necessary that the State aid asked for should be granted to enable the Hospital to carry forward its philanthropic work.

The house that now constitutes the Hospital originally cost \$15,000 but was purchased at a largely reduced sum and is furnished with modern plumbing, sanitary conveniences, steam heating plant and is in every way admirably adapted for its present use.
