IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 463 of the Private and  
Special Laws of 1897, relating to the taking of alewives in  
Bagaduce river.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section one of chapter four hundred and sixty-  
2 three of the Private and Special Laws of 1897 is hereby  
3 amended by striking out in the seventh line thereof the words  
4 "five hundred" and inserting in place thereof the word 'fifty'  
5 and by adding to said section the following, 'but there shall  
6 be a close time on such fishing on Monday, Wednesday and  
7 Friday,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The taking of alewives, except by hand dip net  
9 and weirs, between Johnson's narrows and the head of Walk-

10 er's or Gray's pond, so called, is hereby prohibited, under a  
11 penalty of ten dollars for each fish so taken or caught in  
12 violation of this act. Provided, however, that it shall be  
13 lawful to catch alewives with a gill net on the Bagaduce river  
14 between Johnson's narrows and a point fifty yards from the  
15 fishway at Walker's pond, but there shall be a close time on  
16 such fishing on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.'
