STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter 211, Private Laws of 1895, relating to the Bangor Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 2 of said act is hereby amended so that when 2 amended it shall read as follows:

'Section 2. Said court shall have jurisdiction concurrent 4 with the supreme judicial court as follows:

First, of all civil actions wherein the debt or damages 6 demand, exclusive of costs, does not exceed three hundred 7 dollars, in which any person summoned as trustee resides 8 within the county of Penobscot, or if a corporation, has its 9 office or established usual place of business in said county; 10 or, if said actions are not commenced by a trustee process,

11 any defendant that resides in said county, or, if no defendant 12 resides within the limits of this State, any defendant is 13 served with process in said county, or the goods, or estate, 14 or effects of any defendant are found within said county, and 15 attached on the original writ, but no proceedings under the 16 laws relating to divorce shall be included, within the juris-17 diction of said court.

Second, of the offensive crimes specified in sections 74 and 19 80 of chapter 52, Revised Statutes, chapter 126 relating to 20 gambling, sections 1 and 6, chapter 125, Revised Statutes, 21 sections 23 and 28, chapter 119, Revised Statutes, sections 22 1, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12, chapter 121, Revised Statutes, sections 21 23 and 22, chapter 123, Revised Statutes, sections 1 to 5 inclu-24 sive of chapter 124 Revised Statutes, sections 1, 4, 5 and 6 25 of chapter 125 of the Revised Statutes, sections 1, 4, 5 of 26 chapter 126 of Revised Statutes, sections 1 and 4 of chapter 27 127 of the Revised Statutes, when the value of the money, 28 goods, or other property or thing, alleged to have been fraud-29 ulently obtained, sold, mortgaged or fraudulently removed 30 or concealed is not alleged to exceed thirty dollars, and on 31 conviction, may punish for any of said crimes, or offenses 32 by fines not exceeding one hundred dollars or imprisonment 33 in the county jail not exceeding six months; also of the 34 offenses described in section 6 of chapter 125 of the Revised 35 Statutes and on conviction, may punish therefore by impris-36 onment in the county jail for not more than sixty days, and 37 by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, also for all 38 other crimes and offenses committed in said county of Penob-39 scot, which are by law, punishable by a fine not exceeding 40 one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not exceeding six 41 months, to such other crimes and offenses committed in said 42 county, jurisdiction whereof is expressly conferred upon 43 municipal courts by any general statute, and, upon convic-44 tion, may punish therefore, as provided by law, section three.
