IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 12 of chapter 140 of the Revised

Statutes relating to coroner's inquests.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section 12 of chapter 140 of the Revised Stat-
- 2 utes is hereby amended by striking out the fifth, sixth, sev-
- 3 enth and eighth lines and inserting in the place thereof the
- 4 following, 'party giving notice that a dead body has been
- 5 found, and the person who picked up such dead body, and
- 6 the person who has had the care of such body until taken
- 7 charge of by the coroner, shall be paid a suitable compensa-
- 8 tion by the county for their personal services,' so that said
- 9 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 12. The coroner, whether an inquest is held or not, 11 the jurors, witnesses and any other person required to sum12 mon jurors or witnesses, shall be allowed, in addition to the 13 regular fees, a sum sufficient to make a reasonable compen14 sation for all their services and expenses, and the party giv15 ing notice that a dead body has been found, and the person 16 who picked up such dead body, and the person who has had 17 the care of such body until taken charge of by the coroner, 18 shall be paid a suitable compensation by the county for their 19 personal services.'
