## STATE OF MAINE.

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the North Chesterville Light and Power Company in the village of North Chesterville in the towns of Chesterville and Farmington in the county of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. J. Lenton Keith, Leonard S. Keith and C. 2 Arthur Pinkham and such persons as they may associate with 3 themselves in the enterprise, and their successors are hereby 4 incorporated into a corporation, by the name of North Ches-5 terville Electric Light and Power Company, for the purpose 6 of making, generating, selling and supplying electricity for 7 lighting. manufacturing and mechanical purposes, in the vil-8 lage of North Chesterville, situated in the town of Chester-9 ville and partly in the town of Farmington in the county of 10 Franklin.

#### HOUSE-No. 345.

Sect. 2. The said corporation is authorized to make con-2 tracts with the inhabitants of said village of North Chester-3 ville for the purpose of supplying light and power as con-4 templated by this act.

Sect. 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized and empow-2 ered to contract, lay, maintain and operate lines of wire or 3 material for the transmission of such electricity across any 4 stream or river, along and over streets, ways and bridges in 5 said village of North Chesterville.

Sect. 4. In erecting poles and laying said lines of wire 2 upon, along and over streets, ways and bridges, said corpora-3 tion shall be subject to the laws of the State, applicable to 4 corporations which are authorized to make, generate, sell, 5 distribute and supply electricity for power and lighting.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
