STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes, by providing for the incorporation of yacht clubs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter fifty-seven of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word “society” in the ninth line the words ‘as a yacht club,’ so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. When seven or more persons desire to be incorporated as proprietors of a social, military, literary, scientific or county law library; as a Masonic lodge or chapter of any order or degree; as a lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows; as a division of the Sons of Temperance; as a tent of Rechabites; as a grange of Patrons of Husbandry; as a council of the Sovereigns of Industry; as a Grand Army post;

12 as a relief or benefit association for mutual assistance; as a
13 monument or memorial association; as a society to promote
14 temperance; as a village improvement society; as a yacht
15 club, or for any literary, scientific, musical, charitable, educa-
16 tional, social, military, agricultural, moral, religious or
17 benevolent purpose; they may apply in writing to any justice
18 of the peace in the county, who may issue his warrant,
19 directed to one of said applicants, requiring him to call a
20 meeting thereof at such time and place as the justice may
21 appoint.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
