IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

---

AN ACT to regulate the taking of white perch and black bass  
in Whitney and Hogan ponds, in the county of Oxford, also  
Tripp pond, in the county of Androscoggin.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. In addition to the general law it shall be unlaw-  
ful to kill any white perch in Whitney or Hogan ponds, situ-  
ated in the town of Oxford, county of Oxford, or in Tripp  
pond, in Poland, county of Androscoggin, which does not  
measure eight inches in length from tip of nose to tip of tail,  
or any black bass which does not measure twelve inches in  
length from tip of nose to tip of tail.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, camping party  
or family to kill or carry away more than twenty perch in  
all in any one day from said ponds.

Sect. 3. It shall be unlawful to fish for any kind of fish  
2 in any of the tributaries to either of said ponds.

Sect. 4. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act  
2 are hereby repealed.
