STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section twelve of chapter four of the Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and three as amended by chapter three hundred and thirty-five of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and three.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section twelve of chapter four of the Revised
- 2 Statutes of 1903, as amended by chapter three hundred and
- 3 thirty-five of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and three
- 4 is hereby amended by adding after the word "town" in the
- 5 last line, the following: 'Provided, however, any town elect-
- 6 ing three selectmen, three overseers of the poor, and three
- 7 assessors, if it shall vote so to do, may elect one member of
- 8 each of the three above-named boards for one year, one for
- 9 two years and one for three years, and at each annual meet-

10 ing thereafter one member of each of said boards shall be 11 elected for a term of three years.

Towns electing more than three selectmen, three overseers 13 of the poor and three assessors, may by vote determine how 14 many of each board shall be elected annually and the tenure 15 of their office,' so that the section as amended shall read as 16 follows:

'Sect. 12. Annual town meetings shall be held in March 18 and the voters shall then choose by a major vote, a clerk, 19 three, five or seven inhabitants of the town to be selectmen 20 and overseers of the poor, when other overseers are not 21 chosen, three or more assessors, two or more fence viewers, 22 treasurer, surveyors of lumber, tything men, sealers of 23 leather, measurers of wood and bark, constables, collectors 24 of taxes and other usual town officers; and if one-third of the 25 voters present are in favor thereof, they shall choose, by a 26 major vote, one auditor of accounts, all of whom shall be 27 sworn. Treasurers and collectors of towns shall not be 28 selectmen or assessors, until they have completed their duties 29 as treasurers and collectors and had a final settlement with 30 the town. Provided, however, any town electing three 31 selectmen, three overseers of the poor and three assessors, 32 if they shall vote so to do, may elect one member of each of 33 the above-named boards for one year, one for two years and 34 one for three years, and at each annual meeting thereafter 35 one member of each of the said boards shall be elected for a 36 term of three years; towns electing more than three select-37 men, three overseers of the poor and three assessors, may by 38 vote determine how many of each of said boards shall be 39 elected annually and the tenure of their offices.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
