STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Greenbush.

Resolved, That the sum of seventeen dollars and seventy-2 five cents (\$17.75) be and hereby is appropriated to be paid 3 to the town of Greenbush to re-imburse said town for expense 4 incurred on account of burial of one Gaspaw Ronco, a State 5 pauper, who was a resident of the Penobscot Indian Reser-6 vation.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Gaspaw Ronco, a French Canadian, resided during the greater part of his life on the several islands forming the reservation of the Penobscot Indians. At the time of his death said Ronco was a resident of Olamon island, and Greenbush being the nearest town the expense of burial was paid by said town.
