RESOLVE in favor of the town of Falmouth.

Resolved, That there be paid to the town of Falmouth the 2 sum of fifty-eight dollars and sixty-six cents (\$58.66) to 3 reimburse the town for its loss of State school fund to that 4 amount on account of an error in the enumeration of persons 5 between the ages of four and twenty-one on April I, 1903.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

I, F. E. Freese of Falmouth, Cumberland county, Maine, on oath depose and say that an error was made in the school census for the town of Falmouth for the year 1903. Namely, that the number of scholars between the ages of 4 and 21 years residing in said town on the first day of April, 1903, was reported to be four hundred fifteen (415) whereas it should have been four hundred thirty-six (436).
