IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

---

AN ACT to prohibit the hunting of ducks and other water fowl  
in Merrymeeting bay, Eastern river and the Kennebec river  
below Gardiner and Randolph bridge, by the use of steam,  
naphtha or gasoline boats.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

It shall be unlawful for any person at any time in any boat  
2 propelled by steam, naphtha, gasoline, electricity, or any  
3 power other than sail or hand power, in any of the waters of  
4 the Kennebec river below Gardiner and Randolph bridge, of  
5 the Eastern river, or of Merrymeeting bay, to chase, hunt,  
6 gun or shoot any sea bird, ducks, or water fowl under a  
7 penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one  
8 hundred dollars and costs for each offense.
