STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Gray for reimbursement for
money paid on account of Riley Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred seventeen dollars
2 and forty-two cents be and is hereby appropriated for the
3 purpose of reimbursing the town of Gray for money paid on
4 account of Herbert N. Verrill of Riley Plantation, a State
5 pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Herbert N. Verrill, a State pauper, fell into distress in the town of Gray in Cumberland county and was himself and family assisted in the sum of one hundred seventeen dollars and forty-two cents. The town asks to be reimbursed.
