STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT additional to and amendatory of chapter twenty-nine,
Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, entitled
“An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Light and Heat Com-
pany.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The Kennebec Light and Heat Company is
2 hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds for the
3 payment of or the refunding of its indebtedness and for the
4 further construction and improvement of its works and plant,
5 for such an amount and upon such rate and time as it may
6 deem expedient and necessary, not to exceed the sum of one
7 hundred and fifty thousand dollars in addition to the amount

8 of its present bonded indebtedness, and may secure the same
9 by a mortgage or deed of trust of its franchise or franchises,
10 property and estate owned by, or to be hereafter acquired by
11 said corporation, but said mortgage shall not diminish the
12 security of the bonds heretofore issued by said corporation,
13 remaining unpaid.

Sect. 2. Said Kennebec Light and Heat Company, its suc-
2 cessors and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to
3 extend its business into and supply light, heat and power by
4 the manufacture of gas and electricity in and to the towns of
5 Chelsea and Richmond, and is hereby given and granted the
6 same authority, rights and privileges to conduct, transact and
7 carry on its business in said above named towns that it has
8 in other towns named in its act of incorporation.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
