AN ACT to incorporate the Union Cemetery Improvement  
Company.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Warren Hills, Herbert A. Hawes, Elvira Cobb,  
2 Dora Comery, Lovey Jones, Margaret Thompson, Harriet  
3 Miranda Robbins, Lucy Daniels, Vienna C. Walker, James  
4 Fosset, Elisha Mero, Edgar Wolcott, Anna Jones, Samuel  
5 G. Hills, Hampton Robbins, Fred A. Alden, L. Roscoe  
6 Morse, George W. Bachelder, Patience M. Rice, Elias H.  
7 Burkett, Ellen Wiley, Lizzie Elliott, Hamelin Bowes, William  
8 Green, Charles Lucas, Ann Mossman, William Bessey,  
9 Izora Gleason, John L. Bradford, Adelbert P. Robbins and  
10 F. Ellen Burkett, all of Union in the county of Knox and

11 State of Maine, and C. I. Burrows, Lucy E. Burton, Charles  
12 E. Barnard and C. M. Walker, all of Rockland in said county  
13 of Knox and State of Maine, their associates, successors and  
14 assigns, are hereby incorporated by the name of the Union  
15 Cemetery Improvement Company, for the purpose of caring  
16 for, beautifying and keeping in order generally, the cemetery  
17 situated in the town of Union aforesaid, a short distance  
18 from Union common and generally known as the Union  
19 cemetery.

Sect. 2. Said company is hereby authorized to receive from  
2 any person, corporation or other source, money or property  
3 and to hold and use the same for the purposes set forth in  
4 section 1 of this act. Said company is hereby authorized to  
5 make such by-laws as are necessary to carry out the provi-  
6 sions of this act. The first meeting of said company may be  
7 called by a notice thereof, signed by any five of the corpo-  
8 rators herein named and served upon each corporator by  
9 publishing the same for three consecutive weeks in some  
10 newspaper printed in said county of Knox, the last publica-  
11 tion to be at least seven days before the time of meeting.

Sect. 3. This act shall become null and void in two years  
2 from the time when the same takes effect, unless the corpo-  
3 ration shall have organized under this charter.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
