STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Trescott.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated, to wit: one hundred and fifty dollars
3 for the year nineteen hundred and five, and one hundred and
4 fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and six, to the
5 town of Trescott in maintaining its roads and bridges, said
6 sums to be expended under the direction of the county com-
7 missioners of Washington county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Trescott is a town having a population of 463, a valuation of \$54,801. The tax rate of 1904 was 33 mills and the town debt is 4,500.

Trescott has forty miles of road and four bridges over fifty feet in length, besides eight smaller bridges from 15 to 36 feet long.

There is no manufacturing in this town ; the people depending wholly upon farming and fishing for their living.
