IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to authorize Wadsworth and Woodman to take water
from Lake Maranocook.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Herbert E. Wadsworth and Harris S. Wood-
2 man, copartners as Wadsworth and Woodman, their succes-
3 sors and assigns, are hereby authorized to draw and use
4 from Lake Maranocook not exceeding fifteen thousand gal-
5 lons of water a day for use, for all domestic and industrial
6 purposes, upon the premises formerly owned by the Maine
7 Condensed Milk Factory Company property. For such pur-
8 pose a pipe may be extended into said lake from said prem-
9 ises. Authority is hereby granted to also lay and maintain
10 such pipe in the street upon which said premises are situated

11 as may be necessary to reach the buildings thereon. The
12 acceptance of the right given by this section shall be evi-
13 denced by a declaration of such acceptance, signed by the
14 beneficiaries, filed in the registry of deeds for the county of
15 Kennebec, specifying therein the maximum quantity of water
16 so to be used per day and the size of the pipe so to be laid
17 therefor.

Sect. 2. Any person, firm or corporation, sustaining legal
2 damage hereunder may have such damages, if any, estimated,
3 secured, determined and paid as in case of railroads by begin-
4 ning appropriate proceedings therefor at any time within
5 twelve months after the filing of said acceptance in the regis-
6 try of deeds. No damages shall be allowed hereunder except
7 as may be required by the law of the land now in force.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
