STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Sokokis lake, so called, in the town of Limerick, also its tributaries, and in Long and West ponds, in Parsonsfield, in the county of York.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be an annual close time for fishing
2 for any kind of fish in Sokokis lake, so called, in the town of
3 Limerick, and in all of the tributary waters of said lake
4 including Brown's brook, so called, above the dam at Lim-
5 erick Mills in the towns of Limerick, Cornish and Parsons-
6 field, and Long pond and West pond, so called, in Parsons-
7 field, at the headwaters of said stream, as follows:

It shall be unlawful to fish in said waters for any kind of
9 fish for a period of five years from the date of the approval

10 of this act, except that during the month of August of each
11 year that bass and pickerel may be taken in the ordinary
12 way with hook and line from the waters of said Sokokis lake,
13 and in said Long pond and West pond from June 15th to
14 September first of each year.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
2 shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the
3 general law of the State for illegal fishing.
