STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and eighty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, entitled, "An Act to Incorporate the Castine Water Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Amend section two of said act as follows: In
2 the seventh line of said section insert a comma after the
3 word "lands" and in the same line insert a comma after the
4 word "described"; also amend said section by striking out all
5 of said section after the word "pipe" in the thirteenth line, so
6 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 2. The purposes of said corporation being public
8 purposes, the said corporation for said purposes, may take,

9 detain, divert and use so much of the waters of any lake,
10 stream, or artesian well now existing in said town of Castine,
11 as may be necessary therefor, and further, for said purposes,
12 said corporation may purchase or take and hold as for public
13 uses, such lands, and such waters herein before described, as
14 may be necessary for obtaining, securing, conducting and
15 distributing an ample supply of water for the uses con-
16 templated in the charter, including lands for reservoirs,
17 pipes, windmills and other structures of said corporation.
18 Not more than one rod in width of land shall be used for
19 laying any one line of pipe.'
