STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to regulate the use of the roads in the town of Castine.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The town of Castine in the county of Hancock
2 at any legal meeting of the voters thereof, may close to the
3 use of automobiles the following streets within its limits: So
4 much of Main street as extends north of Water street; so
5 much of Water street as extends west of Main street; so
6 much of High street as extends west of State street; so much
7 of Wadsworth Cove road as extends from Fort George to
8 Wadsworth Cove, shore or beach; so much of Penobscot
9 Bay road as extends north of the Bagaduce road. Any

10 street or road so closed or so much thereof as is closed, shall
11 be marked at the point where it is closed, by a sign board in
12 large letters, "No automobiles allowed on this road."

The term automobile as used in this section applies to all
14 motor vehicles propelled by power. For the violation of this
15 act the town of Castine may vote at said meeting what pun-
16 ishment shall be inflicted for the violation thereof, but for the
17 first offence, not over fifty dollars, and cost of prosecution ;
18 for the second offence, not over fifty dollars or thirty days
19 imprisonment or both, and cost of prosecution.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
