STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit fishing in Breakneck brook and its tributaries, situated partly in the towns of Sebago and Baldwin, county of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Breakneck brook or in any
3 of its tributaries, situated partly in the towns of Sebago and
4 Baldwin, county of Cumberland, under the same penalty as is
5 provided in the general law of the State for illegal fishing.
