

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Mariaville.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and five and three hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and six be and is hereby appropriated to assist the town of Mariaville in the repair of bridges in said town. Said appropriation to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Hancock county, and that the same be paid, when said commissioners shall certify to the governor and council that the sums appro-

9 priated have been expended in the repair of said bridges.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

SIZE OF BRIDGES.

First: ½ of Jordan bridge, between Waltham and Mariaville across the Maine river. Stream ordinary height, 110 feet wide; span, 70 feet wide; each approach, 200 feet wide; total length, 470.

Second: ½ of Jones bridge between Waltham and Mariaville. Length over water, 60 feet; approach, 40 feet; approach, 50 feet; total, 150 feet.

Third: ½ of Great Falls bridge between No. Mariaville and Waltham. Length of bridge over water, 65 feet; each approach 30 feet, 60 feet; total, 125 feet.

Fourth: All of Goodwin's bridge. It is a steel bridge. One span, 80 feet; one span, 30 feet; one approach, 45 feet; one approach, 150 feet; total length, 305 feet.

Fifth: All of Frost brook bridge. Bridge, 30 feet; each approach, 25, 50 feet; total, 80 feet.

Sixth: All of Garlands brook bridge. Bridge over water, 30 feet; approaches, 50, 100 feet; total, 130 feet.

Seventh: All of Tannery brook bridge. Bridge over water, 35 feet; approaches, 40-30, 70 feet; total, 105.

Eighth: All of Alanson Jordon bridge. Bridge over water, 35 feet; approaches, 30 and 20, 50 feet; total, 85 feet.

Have four small bridges from 10 to 15 feet of covering.

Valuation of town, 1904, \$49,718.00.

Rate of taxation, 3 per cent.

Number of miles of road, 25 m.

Number of polls, 70.
