STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit the throwing of sawdust and other mill waste into Break-Neck brook and tributaries, in Cumberland county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall put, or allow the same to be
2 done by any person within his employ, into Break-Neck
3 brook, or in any of its tributaries, in the county of Cumber-
4 land, any mill waste, slabs, edgings, sawdust, or any other
5 mill waste of a fibrous nature created in the manufacture of
6 any sawn or planed lumber, or to place or deposit the same
7 on the banks of any of these waters in such negligent or
8 careless manner that the same shall fall or be washed into
9 any of said waters, or with the intent that the same shall fall
10 or be washed into any of said waters.

Sect. 2. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than fifty dollars
3 nor more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution
4 for each offense.

Trial justices, municipal and police courts shall have orig-
6 inal and concurrent jurisdiction for offenses arising under
7 this act, and all fines recovered shall be paid to the treasurer
8 of State for the benefit of the fund for the protection and
9 propagation of fish.
