STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter 211, Private Laws of 1895, relating to the Bangor Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 3 of said act is hereby amended so that it shall read 2 as follows:

'Section 3. Said court shall have concurrent jurisdiction

4 with the supreme judicial court in the county of Penobscot

5 of all larcenies as described in the Revised Statutes, sections

6 one, six, seven, and ten, chapter one hundred and twenty-

7 one, when the value of the property is not alleged to exceed

8 thirty dollars; and of the offenses described in sections one

9 and four, chapter one hundred and twenty-seven, when the 10 value of the property is not alleged to exceed thirty dollars; II and of the offenses described in section four, chapter one 12 hundred and thirty-three, when they are not of a high and 13 aggravated nature; and of the offenses described in sections 14 one, eight, and ten, chapter one hundred and twenty-eight, 15 when the damage or injury done is not alleged to exceed 16 thirty dollars, and on conviction of any or all the aforesaid 17 crimes and misdemeanors, may punish by fine not exceeding 18 one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail 19 not exceeding six months; and of the offenses relating to 20 gambling in sections one and two, chapter one hundred and 21 twenty-six, and of the offenses described in sections seventy-22 four and eighty, chapter fifty-two, relating to punishment 23 for intoxication of certain railroad employees, and for dis-24 orderly conduct in public conveyances, and of offenses 25 described in section six, chapter one hundred twenty-five, 26 and may punish for said offenses as provided by law."
