STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Matthias A. Cullan of Belfast.

Resolved, That Matthias A. Cullan of Belfast, late of Company H, First Regiment Maine Militia, be granted an increase of pension, so that he shall receive eight dollars per month, instead of four dollars per month, which he is now receiving.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Matthias A. Cullan of Belfast was a sergeant in Company H, First Regiment Maine Militia, and had been appointed or detailed as color bearer. On September 13, 1877, at a muster of the regiment at Augusta, while carrying the colors, he was prostrated by heat and has ever since suffered with the asthma. He is unable to do any manual labor, has no property and no income except the four dollars per month he receives from the State.
