STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the president and trustees of Bowdoin
College.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and sixty-four dol-
2 lars and thirty-two cents be and the same is hereby appro-
3 priated to reimburse the president and trustees of Bowdoin
4 College for a tax paid by said corporation to the city of
5 Portland for the year 1904, on real estate in said city owned
6 by said corporation since 1878.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The president and trustees of Bowdoin College have owned since 1878 the premises at No. 16 Exchange street, Portland. The tax on said real estate has for fifteen years been paid by the corporation to the city, and repaid to the corporation by the State, until the year 1904. In that year the tax assessed on said premises was one hundred and sixty-four dollars and thirty-two cents. It was paid by the corporation prior to September 30, 1904, and on that day the usual application was made for reimbursement, but the application was not received by the secretary of State, to whom it was mailed. The time within which the State treasurer is authorized to make such reimbursement has now expired. The claim for reimbursement is made under chapter 9, section 6 and 11 of the Revised Statutes.
