STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the King's Daughters' Home, Bangor,
Maine.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars for the year
2 nineteen hundred and five and five hundred dollars for the
3 year nineteen hundred and six, be and is hereby appropriated
4 for the purpose of assisting in maintaining the King's
5 Daughters' Home of Bangor.

THE KING'S DAUGHTERS' HOME, BANGOR.

ITS WORK.

The aim of this Home is to aid young girls by temporary shelter and help when they are in need, and also to assist them in fitting themselves to be self supporting.

ITS MEANS OF SUPPORT.

The Home is supported by contributions from the King's Daughters, and also by the nominal board paid by those among its inmates who are able to pay anything.
