STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of John D. Bubier.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State
2 to John D. Bubier of Lewiston, Maine, eight dollars per month
3 during the pleasure of the legislature on account of severe
4 injuries received by him while in the discharge of his duties
5 under the State militia. Said pension of eight dollars per
6 month commencing from and after the approval of this
7 resolve.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John D. Bubier of Lewiston, is fifty-four years of age. On the 17th day of August, 1883, he was accidentally shot by the captain of his company while engaged in the military service of the State, the bullet entering his person in such a way as to seriously affect his nerves, and as a result of his injuries he has become blind in one eye and partially blind in the other. For eighteen months after he was wounded he was confined to the house and for a long period of time after that he was unable to perform any work whatever. At the present time, by reason of his infirmities he has become incapacitated from following his trade, and has to do other work, when he is able to work at all, for which he receives a meagre compensation. He has a wife and children dependent upon him, and his only means of support is derived from his labor.
