STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Kennebec Valley Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That chapter 159 of the Private and Special Laws of 1903, 2 entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Valley Rail-3 road Company," is hereby amended as follows: By inserting

4 after the word "lake," in section nine of said act, in the

5 seventh line of said section, the words 'and thence along the

6 west shore of Moosehead lake, past the North West Carry,

7 through the town of Seboomook, to the west branch of the

8 Penobscot river, and along said Penobscot river, easterly,

9 past the North East Carry, to some point on the shore of

IO Chesuncook lake.' So that said section, as amended, shall II read as follows, viz.:

'Section 9. Upon and after the completion of the aforesaid 13 sale or lease the said Kennebec Valley Railroad Company 14 shall be and hereby is authorized to locate, construct, equip, 15 maintain, and operate a railroad from some point in the town 16 of Bingham, in the county of Somerset, by the most feasible 17 route within the valley of the Kennebec river, by such course 18 within said territory to some point or place on the west shore 19 of Moosehead lake, and thence along the west shore of 20 Moosehead lake, past the North West Carry, through the 21 town of Seboomook, to the west branch of the Penobscot 22 river, and along said Penobscot river, easterly, past the North 23 East Carry, to some point on the shore of Chesuncook lake, 24 as the directors of said corporation in the exercise of their 25 best judgment shall deem most favorable and best calculated 26 to promote public convenience, with all the powers and sub-27 ject to all the liabilities incident to railroad corporations 28 under the general laws of the State.'
